Isn't it really only for commercial trucks & drivers operating long haul?

- Road safety is everyone's responsibility
- MVAR Division 37 defines commercial motor vehicle (CMV) as:
 - Trucks, truck tractors or business vehicles with a GVW over 5000 kg
 - Buses (10 or more passengers plus the driver)
 - Operating under the Passenger Transportation Act (e.g. taxis)
- Hours of Service (HOS) rules apply to drivers of:
 - CMVs with a GVW over 11,794 kg
 - Commercial passenger vehicles
- Basic HOS requirements are not changing



So, who has to use ELDs?

- Electronic Logging Devices (ELDs)
 - As of January 1, 2023 any CMV plated in B.C. operating outside of B.C.
 - As of August 1, 2023 any CMV that operates outside 160 km radius from home terminal
 - Within 160 km radius, the carrier may choose to use local time records

• ELD Exemptions (highlights)

- Any CMV manufactured before model year 2000
- Rental vehicles (no more than 30 days)
- Occasional use outside of 160 km



When can we use local time records?


• Local driving hours – as of August 1, 2023 (new section MVAR 37.28)

• Driver requirements:

- Within 160 km radius of home terminal
- Take at least 10 hours off-duty time in a day
- Return to home terminal to take at least 10 consecutive hours off-duty time before accumulating any additional on-duty time
- Take at least 24 consecutive hours off-duty time in the previous 14 days

• Carrier requirements:

- Maintain accurate and legible records for 6 months for each day the driver is on duty showing:
 - Cycle followed
 - Time driver reports for duty
 - Time driver is released from duty
 - Total number of hours the driver is on-duty



160 km radius from Home Base of Penticton Example




